Dear Parents,

READ aloud to them, even as Explorers. Initially, the sound of your voice is a beacon of calmness, conditioning the child to associate you and the book with security. As the child grows, so too does the time you should spend reading in one sitting, from a few minutes to at least 20 minutes, from picture books to chapter books.

With the children of the class of Explorers settled down, it is now a lot of fun as they take part in activities related to the UOIs for the month. While some are still learning to speak, others are able to confidently identify the picture flash cards presented to them.

Artwork this week for the Explorers was a mix of colouring and sticking. The children had fun colouring their school bag and were enthralled as they stuck the TLC uniform onto a piece of paper. Another interesting activity involved the identifying and matching of different rooms in a house. The children have been introduced to various flashcards including wild animals, pet animals, colours and shapes.

Where Montessori was concerned, the class was engaged in a few activities. While some had to pour water from 1 tumbler into another, the others had fun learning how to open and close assorted

bottles. Their favourite Montessori activity however, was the sorting of animals according to colour.

*Special Thursday* was sports this week and the little children had lots of fun as they raced to the finish line in a small race conducted for them. It was a pleasure to see the smiles on their faces as they ran as fast as they could.

Next week we will be revising all the topics covered during the month of July and will also be singing songs related to the UOI.

## Discoverers

After the excitement of 'Family Day' last Friday, we had an exciting and great week at school. This week was a revision of all that we learnt.

We revisited our UOI's 'My Family', 'My Home', 'My Neighbourhood', 'People who help us'.

We completed our artwork, and continued



to sing songs related to the topic.

We talked about different people who live in our neighbourhood. Re-enacted our Special Drama Thursday and looked forward to our playtime outside.

**Montessori:** Transferring water with a sponge, colour box 2, presentation tray, sorting according to colours and shapes were presented and practised by the children.

Enquirers

The children created pizzas with the choice of their garnishing this week with different coloured papers.

Special Thursday had them shopping for groceries from the make believe department store which is close to their school which is part of the UOI of their neighbourhood this week. Needless to say that biscuits, ice cream and fruits were the most popular items that the children gleefully shopped for. We also introduced the children to people who help us through work sheets as well as art activities like designing your own shirt and frock, as well as painting traffic signals and the helpful traffic policeman.

Flash cards and puppets of people who help us are being used at circle time. Montessori activities included sweeping with the brush and dust pan, as well as revising cylinder blocks, long rods, hook and eye frame, and geometrical and presentation trays. Tracing letters of c, a, i, o is being done.

Wheels of the bus, dhobhi aaya and family songs are sung everyday at circle time. This week the children's sculpting skills were tickled with making shapes out of coloured play dough. From their snacks, to colourful

vegetables and fruits to automobiles,....their imagination ran riot.

### Rangers 1

This week the children came all set to make their own neighborhood chart after reviewing their neighbourhood with their parents over the weekend and made beautiful drawings of houses, hospital, supermarket, TLC School, park and garden and so on to name a few and put it all together to make a lovely collage and proudly displayed it on the soft board in the classroom, through the making of the chart we discussed with the children about the importance of keeping their neighborhood clean and green and for this we also urged them not to litter and spoke about the importance of planting more trees. Further we moved on by asking our children about who worked in their neighborhood and what their jobs were thus moving onto learn about "People who help us". This week we introduced them to community helpers by showing them pictures and asking them questions on what work these people did and how they contributed to the society and how we need to cooperate with each other and co-exist as each one of us is indispensable to the society. We did worksheets on matching the community helpers to their tools, the vehicles they use and also did a few coloring sheets. Children enjoyed solving the maze by guiding the fire engine to the fire station. Art work this week comprised of making a police car, a fire truck, chef and a nurse. We presented the Land and Water Globe to the class and did worksheets on land, water and air thus revising the Geography concepts.

In Montessori children were introduced to objects with LMA Box1, Box 2, 3 letter words pink series, Seguin Board- Exercise- 1-Beads, Exercise 2 – Boards, Exercise 3 – Board and Beads.

On special Thursday children played a game of aiming the ball into the basket and a game called 'Freddie the Frog' to promote eye hand coordination, motor skills and spatial awareness. Going forward next week we will be introducing the children to a lot more community helpers who make our world a much better place to live in.

### Rangers 2

This week our Rangers 2 class, touched on the UOI 'People who help us'.

We remembered our group activity, where we chose the profession of our choice and pasted our picture on the collage.

Worksheets were done and songs were sung.

Professions were discussed in detail and flash cards and audio visual presentations were done as well.

**Science:** Rotation of Earth and what causes Day and Night, How to tell time.

**Geography:** Solar System- We also discussed in detail 'Earth as a planet' – We will continue to study the Solar System in detail

**Montessori:** Object and label Box – 3, LMA – 3 letter words, Picture and label box 4, Pink Series – 3 letter words, Snake game, Cardboard templates with holes.

We look forward to our Funtastic Friday with our parents on the 7<sup>th</sup> August 2015.

During the month of July we continue to revise all that we learnt in the month of July.

### Scholars

With the change of season and everyone falling sick the scholars decided to learn more about germs.

Germs are everywhere and cannot be seen. They were taught that there are 2 types of germs –viruses and bacteria and both are microbes (germs which can be seen only under the microscope).

**Viruses** have an outer shell called Capsid which is like a protein coat and inside the coat is the nucleic acid. How do they make humans or animals sick? They enter the body through the nose, mouth or broken skin. They enter the body cell; remove their coat and their nucleic acid gets mixed up with the human body cell and the cell factory instead of making human body cell start making virus cells and the viruses spread in the body and makes us sick. So how do we remove the virus from our body? The immune system has white blood cell which are like the police in our body and the moment they detect viruses they name them antigen and send antibodies to fight these viruses. At times when someone has fever the viruses are killed due to the hot temperature. Vaccines and medications also kill the virus. How can we avoid viruses: - by washing our hands, covering wounds and avoiding shaking hands with people who are sick! **Bacteria** are also everywhere, but some bacteria's are good bacteria which help us in our daily lives. The yoghurt we eat is made from bacteria, the nitrogen in the soil is fixed by bacteria



and they also help the digestive system to digest food. But there are also bad bacteria which are called **Pathogens** which cause diseases. The moment they enter the body the immune system which has the white blood cells send antibodies to fight the bacteria. Just like viruses they enter the same way and can be killed due to hot temperature, medication and vaccinations. Videos related to the topic were shown to understand the how germs enter our body and how we can avoid them.

### **Geography**

In Geography children saw videos related to Longitude and Latitude. They were explained how there is an imaginary line between the North Pole and the South Pole which is called axis. The line which divides the earth into 2 parts is the equator which is 0 degree and the top part is known as the northern hemisphere and the lower part is known as the southern hemisphere. Longitudes and Latitudes are known as coordinates which helps people to know the exact location of a place. Horizontal imaginary lines running from East to west are called parallels of latitudes and imaginary lines running from north to south are called meridians of longitude. They also learnt directions –North, East, South and West.

### **Language**

In language besides doing their regular notebook work of 2 pages they learnt new sight words –or, one, but, that not, all and formed sentences with them. Videos were shown on 3 letter words and they were also

taught the vowel song.

### **Math**

Practice makes perfect so they are continuously learning number names and counting from 100 to 200. Besides doing their regular 2 pages of notebook writing they have done worksheets on addition. They were also taught 2 digit additions with carryover. Simple subtractions were also taught. They have also done worksheets related to addition.

### **Hindi**

We are revising the 11 alphabets that were taught in class. Worksheets were also done related to the alphabets. Children had to match the alphabet to the picture.

Next week in science and geography they will do revision and a small quiz will be done in class. In Language children will be learning prepositions and doing worksheets on simple sight word sentences. Math will be more revision on addition, bigger and smaller number, subtraction and a quiz on number name from 1 to 10.

# People Who Help Us



**Match the person to the object:** On a chartpaper draw two columns. On one side have the pictures of people who help us for e.g. a dentist, a doctor, a policeman, a postman, a nurse, teacher etc. On the other side have pictures of related objects e.g. fire, a tooth, an envelope, an exercise book etc. Ask the children to match the person to the object by drawing lines.

**Open Puppets:** Help your child to make puppets of community helpers. Talk to the child about each.

**Magnifying glass game:** Print and laminate cards of people who help us. Put them in a ziplock bag. Let the child pick them out one by one and identify them.

Children are always ready to learn new things and find everything very interesting as long as it is presented to them in a proper manner.

Parents are requested to explain to their child that people in the community help each other by offering goods and services. We all need each other to live in a community. Each person is important and has a special role to play. We must respect the people who help us because without their help our lives would not be so easy and comfortable.

Parents please explain to your child that we all need each other to live in a community. People in different occupations deliver services which make our lives easier.

Doctors and nurses help us to stay healthy, the postman delivers mail, policeman keeps our community safe, the gardener grows plants and flowers for us, a green grocer sells vegetables, a farmer grows food for us and so on. Many community workers have work attire or clothes which are easy to identify. The aim is to raise awareness of the benefits of helping people and to introduce vocabulary. Parents please take your child to the local post office, library or grocery store. Talk to them about each person and the important job each performs.

## **Activity:**

**Make cutouts of different community helpers:** Ask your child to speak about each for e.g Q: Who is this? Ans: A teacher. Q: What does the teacher do? Etc.
